Names of the Members of the Doddington Branch of the Bedford Conference

John and Ann Wayman were baptized 31 January 1849 (see above record). In August the same year, John was made President of the Doddington Branch. He became a missionary at this time, and his name shows up on the branch records as the missionary responsible for several baptisms. John says that he had eight different missionary companions (including Lorenzo Snow) and baptized twelve people between 31 January 1849 and 4 January 1852, when he gave his farewell address to the Saints at Doddington, prior to leaving for America.

The Church in Britain and the 1851 Religious Census

In 1837, the first missionaries of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints arrived in England and began preaching the gospel.¹ In the years following, the British Mission experienced an increase of convert baptisms, leading to a Church membership reported in the *Millennial Star* of over 32,000 in 642 branches by 1 June 1851.² The total number of branches listed for England and Wales was 572 with 28,499 members, whereas Scotland, the Channel Islands, and the Isle of Man had 70 branches in all with a total membership of 3,727.

Another source of information on Church membership is branch membership records, which are available on microfilm at the Family History Library in Salt Lake City. The library's catalog shows branch records from 386 branches in England and Wales that include the period of 1851.³ As can be inferred from the difference in the number of existing branch membership records and the number of branches reported in the *Millennial Star*, many English and Welsh branches of the Church from the 1851 time period are not currently documented. With only these two sources of information about the Church in Britain, we have no way of knowing more about other possible branches.

However, another primary source exists that originated outside of the Church for the year 1851. Along with the population enumeration, the British government conducted a religious census in March of 1851. The census estimated the LDS Church membership as over 30,000 in 222 places of worship in England and Wales.⁴ When the 1851 religious census is compared with the Church's branch membership records, we find that these two

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sources of information augments our knowledge of the early Church in Britain.

The purpose of this article and the accompanying chart located at the end of the article is to make available a branch-by-branch comparison of these two major sources of Church membership in 1851. Although the Millennial Star published overall charts of the number of branches and members of each conference in the British Mission, it did not specify branch names or places. Therefore, as a comparison tool, the data are not particularly useful except for the global numbers mentioned above. The two types of records being used for this article and the chart following are the 1851 religious census and the branch membership records that are currently found in the Family History Library Catalog. 6

1851 Religious Census


On Sunday, 30 March 1851, clergymen from all religions identified throughout Britain were instructed to complete a form regarding the number of available seats and the number of individuals attending religious services in each church, chapel, or meeting room that day. The main reason given for conducting such a census was to find out if the churches and meeting places could accommodate the ever-growing population—if everyone went to church. The government was also interested in how many people actually attended religious services.⁷

The census enumerators were given the responsibility of finding all the meeting places of the different churches in their district and providing the church leaders with the required forms. This task would have been relatively simple with regard to finding the parish churches and chapels of the established church, but the process was a good deal more difficult to find nonconformist religions, especially those who met in rented halls, homes, or other unrecognizable "church" buildings.

The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints is a good example of a religion that had a number of congregations meeting in places that may not have been recognized as churches. For this reason, the census enumerators understandably passed by many of the organized branches of the Church without knowing to ask for a census return from the presiding authority. The fact that such a large discrepancy exists between the number of branches reported in the *Millennial Star* and the number of meeting places reported by the 1851 census is evidence that many enumerators simply did not know that a religious service for the Church was going on in their registration districts.

Despite the fact that only 222 forms were returned for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, the number of attenders at the church meetings held on census Sunday was above thirty thousand—a fairly large number for so few branches. One difficulty in calculating the total attendance comes about in the concept of "twicing," meaning that there was no way to account for people who may have attended church meetings more than once on that day. Therefore, the number of attenders probably does not reflect the actual number of members or investigators of the Church. The purpose of this article. however, is to examine the number and places of the branches, not the number of attenders in each branch. Therefore, if the reader desires more information on the census and the many studies that have been conducted using its data, an excellent review and bibliographical guide is provided by Clive D. Field.8

Church Membership Records

The Church of Jesus Christ was instructed from its very earliest years to keep a record of baptisms, ordinations, and children's blessings. Hence, many branches in England and Wales kept records of their members, often recording names, dates and places of birth, and information on baptism, confirmation, and other church ordinances. The branch records were organized by branch name and are on microfilm in the Salt Lake Family History Library.

One of the difficulties in searching for individuals in the branch records is that many times branches drew members from several miles away from the center of the branch. Therefore, family or church historians who would like to find branch localities for an individual who did not live in the same hamlet, parish, or town where the branch was located might be confused and unable to find the nearby branch where the individual attended. ¹⁰ In the

Family History Library Catalog, the branch records are categorized by place name, leading to the possibility that a family historian would not look for church records in neighboring towns or counties.

There are 386 branches in England and Wales in 1851 for which the Family History Library has branch records available. Presumably, at one time more branch records existed, since the figure of 386 comes nowhere near the 572 branches reported in the *Millennial Star*. Because such records would have had to survive many years and many miles of travel from Britain to arrive at the Church Archives in Salt Lake City, several possibilities exist as to the reason why many branch records are currently missing. The most obvious reason is that records were simply lost over time. Another viable reason may come from the fact that branches were combined and dissolved from time to time, and the records from one branch may have been subsumed into another one. Finally, perhaps some branches were not good record keepers.¹¹

Comparison of the 1851 Religious Census and Church Membership Records

Because only 222 meeting places for the Church are found in the 1851 census and because 386 branches with records are found in the Family History Library, we could presume that the census enumerators merely missed many of the branches that were in existence and that all the census places would be found among the branch records. In compiling the branch comparison chart of these two sources, I found that, indeed, many branches were simply missed by the census. However, a substantial number of meeting places reported in the census do not have corresponding branch records now available at the Family History Library. Apparently, many branches either did not keep good records, or those records have been lost in the 150 years since they were written.

Method of Comparison

To compare the census places with the branch membership records, I found exact localities of the census and of the branches. The published report of the 1851 census, found in the *Irish University Press Series of British Parliamentary Papers*, lists tables of census places based on counties, large cities, and registration districts. The registration districts usually encompassed several parishes and sometimes did not follow parish or county lines. For example, the registration district of Basford, Nottinghamshire, has six

congregations of the Church meeting on census Sunday, but from the report alone, there would be no way of knowing the parishes where these meetings took place. However, the original census return lists the parish names and also the names and addresses of the individuals filling out the form, usually the presiding elder or elders of the branches.

The original manuscript returns for the 1851 religious census for England and Wales are found at the Public Record Office in Kew, Surrey, England. 12 In examining them, however, I found that several of the original returns were either not available or were not uniquely identifiable as congregations of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. 13 For example, one return states that the church is called the "London City Mission," which may or may not be a Latter-day Saint group. 14 Therefore, the total number of identified meeting places for the Church in the 1851 census came to only 210. The census places for church congregations were organized by county and registration district, and the parish and presiding authority were listed.

As mentioned previously, branch membership records were found in the Family History Library Catalog. Branch names usually corresponded with the hamlet, parish, or town name in which the branch was located. To make a comparison with the census, I located branches within their parishes and registration districts by using Wilson's *Imperial Gazetteer*. With the registration districts and parishes located, I created a chart listing the branch name as it is found in the Family History Library Catalog and its parish and registration district, enabling me to match the branches with the meeting places of Latter-day Saint congregations as found in the census. The chart is found at the end of this article.

Results of Comparing Census and Branch Records

The overall findings from the comparison of these two major sources listing branches of the Church in England and Wales show that many of the congregations found in the 1851 religious census do match up with known branches of the Church that still have existing branch records. From the point of view of the census, the coverage of Latter-day Saint congregations was quite poor. Only 134 meeting places out of a possible 386 branches with existing membership records were recorded by census enumerators (35 percent%). However, 76 meeting places were recorded by the census for which there are no corresponding branch records. The census provides information about a substantial number of branch locations that have no existing church records.

Conclusion

Comparing these two primary sources, the branch membership records found in the Family History Library and the 1851 religious census of England and Wales, I have shown that establishing a reliable figure for LDS Church membership and the number of branches in the 1850s is more difficult than using a source such as the *Millennial Star* reports or finding the number of branch records in the Family History Library. The 1851 census sheds new light on LDS Church records, not only because it is a contemporary record source but also because it originated from outside the Church's own records. The 1851 religious census allows historians to see that there is more to learn about the Church in Britain because many branches in Britain during the 1850s have not been documented. The chart below is helpful to both Church and family historians because it shows other possible places in England and Wales where Church members might have met and been baptized.

The fact that seventy-six meeting places found in the census do not correspond with existing Church records gives rise to several questions that might be answered by further study. Could these congregations have been separate branches that do not have records? Or could the census places be meeting places that were more convenient for branch members than going to the central branch location? Where have the branch records gone? Could the records actually exist but be unrecognizable because they are catalogued under a different name? These questions may be impossible to answer unless a thorough examination of every branch record is made in some future study.

The purpose of this article was to introduce the 1851 religious census as another possible source for use in research about the Church in nineteenth-century Britain. The chart that follows documents the branches for which there are existing membership records and compares the branches with the congregations that were located by the 1851 census.

Explanation of the Comparison Chart of Branches in England and Wales

The comparison chart has eight columns and is organized alphabetically by country and county. All of the English counties are listed first, with Welsh counties at the end. For this chart, Monmouthshire is counted as part of Wales.

The first column shows the name of the registration district to enable the reader to locate other civil records organized by registration districts, such as civil registration.

The second column lists the LDS branch name or the conference name.

Conferences consisted of several branches that often had their own sets of records. Where they could be identified with a county, the conference records are listed under each county where they belong. Branch names are listed as they are found in the Family History Library Catalog, unless they are misspelled. When misspellings occur in the catalog, the names on the chart are listed as found in *The Imperial Gazetteer* or on a map. When the registration district is actually part of a different county than the parish (districts did not follow county boundaries), the branch is listed under the county of the parish rather than the registration district. For example, Eddlesborough Branch is in Buckinghamshire, but its registration district is Leighton Buzzard, part of Bedfordshire. Therefore, Eddlesborough is found in the chart under Buckinghamshire, although its registration district is also listed under Bedfordshire when connected to another branch.

The third column is the listing of the parish names associated with the branches. If branch names are not the same name as the parish, a parish name is listed. When the branch name is the same as the parish or when there are too many parishes within the city to know where the branch belongs, a parish name is not listed. As examples, Cold Ash Branch in Berkshire is actually located in Thatcham Parish, which is listed in the third column. On the other hand, Newbury Branch in Berkshire is located in Newbury Parish; hence, a parish name is not listed. The city of Reading in Berkshire has several parishes, so no parish name is listed for the Reading Branch.

The fourth column lists the Family History Library film numbers for the branch and conference records. The fifth column lists the time period of the membership records as found in the catalog. When the time period was not listed in the catalog, I examined the record on film and was able to determine the time period fairly closely. No branches are listed in this chart if their membership records began after 1851. A few branch records have records that finish before 1851. These branches are included in the chart because there is a possibility that those branches were still in existence in 1851, even though the records may have been subsumed into another branch or were lost. Several of the census places actually correspond to branches whose records ended before 1851.

The sixth column is the parish name of the meeting place as listed in the 1851 religious census. The census recorded both the parish name and the registration district, but the district is not repeated because it is listed in the first two columns of the chart. When the parish name does not match the branch name from the library catalog but falls within the jurisdiction of the same registration district, I considered the branch and the census place to be a match.

The seventh column contains the name and position of the presiding authority who completed the census form. Generally, the individual is the presiding elder, but at times a clerk, secretary, or even the wife of the presiding elder completed the census return.
